DIY of the Month: Scissor Pouch

Materials



- 0.3m main fabric
- 0.3m lining
- 0.3m fusible fleece
- thread

Sewing Info

- Seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise stated.
- Topstitch: The process of stitching on the exterior side of a project to finish seams or folds to keep them in place. Usually paired with a longer stitch length which looks more professional and can make it easier to go in a straight line. Also can be known as Edge Stitching if it is done near a fold of fabric.
- Edge stitch: : The process of stitching on the exterior side of a project near a fold or seamed edge to keep them in place. Also can be known as Top Stitching if done away from an edge.

Instructions

1. Download our free pouch pattern, cut out and tape together joining the black dots. https://blog.fabriclandwest.com/diy-scissor-pouch



2. Use the pattern to cut out1 x main fabric1 x lining1 x fusible fleece



3. Attach your fusible fleece to the wrong side of your lining, either by pressing or basting stitch.







5. Turn your pouch right side out and press.



6. Edge stitch around the full pouch making sure to close the gap.







7. Following the numbers on the pattern fold 2 on top of 1, Fold 3 on top of 2, Fold 4 on top of 3, pin in place.




8. Topstitch the sides and bottom to secure.








Scissors Pouch




